Strength in Struggle: How Community Support Makes a Difference

Sometimes, a little help can go a long way for those navigating life's toughest challenges. This is especially true for Mdm Nuraini Mohd Noor as she juggles the demands of managing her household while caring for her children, three of whom have disabilities.

Although her 26-year-old daughter, who is married and has moved out, still visits to help, the overwhelming caregiving responsibilities have taken a toll on Mdm Nuraini over the years as the primary caregiver of the family.

Her family also continues to struggle in making ends meet with the bulk of her husband's income being allocated to the children's medical and daily needs.

Help for them comes in the form of monthly \$150 worth of supermarket vouchers, which are part of the Singapore Red Cross – FairPrice Meals with Love programme.

"The vouchers really help because diapers and milk are very expensive. The vouchers ease our family's financial burden and make our lives a lot easier," shared Mdm Nuraini.

Partnering Singapore Red Cross, FairPrice Foundation has committed \$1.2 million over three years from 2022 to 2024 to alleviate food and grocery expenses for the programme's beneficiaries. To date, the programme has benefited some 2,300 individuals from 530 families.

Navigating Illness and Parenthood: Empowering A Family Towards

Resilience

When poor health takes over both parents while trying to raise a child, life can quickly take a challenging turn, making every little bit of hope and help crucial. This is the reality for Mdm Thilagarani and her husband, who are struggling to care for their 11-year-old daughter, Sakthii, under these challenging circumstances.

Championing the 'Heartstrings Buy' Initiative, the FairPrice Group and its Foundation has united its grocery suppliers to donate over \$280,000 to the Community Chest and its partners, including SINDA, to benefit vulnerable families like Mdm Thilagarini's.

While Mdm Thilagarani and her husband receive support for the transport to medical treatments, daily essentials and Sakthii's educational needs, Mdm Thilagarani was also provided with access to counselling and help for suitable job placements.

Mr Lam's Journey to Finding a

Community to Call Home

Community Chest

A mechanic all his life while supporting his 10 younger siblings, 86-year-old Mr Lam suddenly found himself homeless after his landlord's demise at his rental flat. Without a savings safety net, he was faced with helplessness.

Life only took a positive turn when a social worker connected him with AWWA, a non-profit organisation supported by Community Chest. With help from charitable organisations like FairPrice Foundation and more, Mr Lam has a roof over his head and enjoys a community that feels like family.

He is a resident at AWWA's Senior Community Home (SCH), which provides accommodation for the elderly aged 60 and above, and who are recipients of the Public Assistance Scheme, or who have no family or means of financial support for housing.



Driving Change: Our Support for Zero Waste through BYOB 2023

Joining hands as a Presenting Sponsor with Zero Waste SG, FairPrice Foundation donated \$20,000 towards their BYOB 2023 Campaign to educate and inspire Singaporeans to replace single-use plastics with reusable bags instead.



Amidst rising living expenses, FairPrice Foundation stepped up with \$2,000,000 support for FairPrice Co-operative's CHAS Blue Discount Scheme. This marks the fourth initiative, alongside the Pioneer Generation, Merdeka Generation, and Seniors discount schemes, and also provides price cuts of up to 3 per cent to help low-income families.

Championing Alternative Pathways for the Next Generation

In the spirit of Ramadan, FairPrice Foundation donated \$40,000 to Yayaysan MENDAKI to help children from low-income families in the Muslim community gain bursaries, subsidies for school fees and other academic programme initiatives.

Helping Low-income Union Members and Their Families

FairPrice Foundation contributed \$500,000 to NTUC-U Care Fund in support of U Care Assistance Programmes that assist union members, children, youth, the elderly and the underprivileged.



Community Chest Seeds of Sustainable Philanthropy

As part of Community Chest's 40th anniversary and the Ministry of Social and Family Development's Year of Celebrating Social Service Partners, Community Chest hopes to encourage corporate and community partners to give more regularly and sustainably, so that they can empower communities in need to achieve their fullest potential.

This event also sees the introduction of the NCSS 4ST Partnership Fund (4STPF) and how it can be the catalyst for impactful partnerships that lead to scalable solutions for the sector. The 4STPF aims to mobilise the sector (SSAs, social enterprises, ground-up initiatives) to develop solutions that promote innovation, collaboration and empowerment, ultimately leading to an improvement in the quality of life of service users.

The Foundation donated \$100,000 towards the Community Chest cause.



Beyond Bars: Helping Ex-offenders Access Employment Opportunities

Championing the belief that everyone deserves a second chance, the Foundation has pledged \$200,000 to the Yellow Ribbon Singapore to provide ex-offenders a lifeline through employment and training opportunities in the food services, logistics and retail sectors.



Befriending and Extending Support to the Elderly

In our ongoing efforts to ensure that the elderly and the vulnerable are not left behind, we donated \$50,000 in support of FairPrice Retail Therapy @ Ren Ci Programme. The funds are to provide affordable medical, nursing and rehabilitative care services for those who need them the most.

Supporting Workers' Welfare

As part of our support towards workers' welfare, the Foundation donated \$1,000,000 to NTUC, which spearheads the labour movement of Singapore.



Joining the Fight Against Hunger and Waste

While some go hungry, there are others that throw food away. In line with raising awareness on food wastage and its impact on society and the environment, we supported the Food from the Heart's Clean Plate Campaign and Charity Golf Event with a \$100,000 donation to keep daily essentials and food accessible for its low-income beneficiaries and public education campaign on reducing food waste.



Caring for Our Seniors through the Health for Life Fund

The Health for Life Fund was set up to establish, support and promote the material, emotional, psychological and physical welfare of the elderly. As part of the FairPrice Group's 50th anniversary, FairPrice Foundation pledged a donation of \$50 million to the Fund that will benefit seniors, especially those in the lower-income group. This commitment will be fully fulfilled in 2030.



Nourishing Hearts, Minds and Bodies

Partnering Singapore Red Cross – FairPrice Meals With Love has been helping 2,300 individuals from 530 low-income families with access to daily essentials and groceries. FairPrice Foundation committed \$1.2 million for the three-year programme, helping the poor and needy receive food and sustenance they need.

Uniting Hearts to Help Those in Need

In our ongoing support to Community Chest, FairPrice Foundation donated \$300,000 to the Community Chest Charity TV Show – Uniting Hearts 2023. The funds raised go towards supporting more than 100 social service agencies that offer more than 200 critical programmes to those in need. These include special education, youth programmes, adult disability support, persons with mental health conditions, eldercare and caregiver support.



From Adversity to Achievement: FairPrice Foundation Supports Trybe's Youth Empowerment

FairPrice Foundation pledged \$150,000 to support Trybe's Project Thrive programme from 2024 to 2026, providing youth beneficiaries from the Singapore Boys' Hostel with rehabilitation and therapy.

The programme impacted 130 youths from lower income households to receive regular counselling for improved mental and emotional well-being.





Breaking Barriers, Changing Lives Through Bizlink Centre

Partnering Bizlink Centre, FairPrice Foundation donated \$50,000 to enable persons with disabilities in their journey of recovery towards improved mental and emotional wellbeing, and reintegration into the workforce through training and employment.



Keeping Daily Essentials Within Reach for Low-income Families

FairPrice Foundation provided a \$25,000 boost in donation to help keep groceries and daily necessities accessible for the needy families and elderly beneficiaries of the Food Care Programme organised by Cornerstone Community Services.



Empowering Learning for Children from Low-income Families

Committed to serving the community, we presented a donation of \$40,000 to SINDA to support the educational needs of students from low-income families.

Since 2011, FairPrice Foundation has donated over \$360,000 to SINDA, to help children who are identified to receive social and financial support from SINDA.



Uniting for a Change and Building a Caring Society

In support of the cause to build a caring and cohesive society, FairPrice Foundation made a \$300,000 gift towards the President's Challenge. The money donated is channeled to more than 80 benefitting organisations that aid children with special needs, persons with disabilities, address healthcare issues, support families, and assist the elderly in need.



FairPrice Walk For Rice+ Continues to Help Vulnerable Families

The South East Community Development Council and FairPrice Co-operative launched the 15th edition of their annual FairPrice Walk for Rice+ @ South East! Approximately 1,200 participants turned up at 100PLUS Promenade to walk and log in their mileage for a good cause.

The Foundation pledged a donation of 500,000 bowls of white rice and brown rice, and 50,000 bowls of instant oats worth \$100,000, to benefit over 7,000 needy families in the South East District.

The launch also included a best-dressed competition and fringe activities such as trampoline, spin cycling and archery.

Into its 20th consecutive year, Gift from the Heart is a collective effort that brings financial relief and a much-appreciated gesture of care and concern to their lower-income members through a bag of daily necessities. In line with helping families defray their cost of living, FairPrice Foundation made a gift of \$40,000 to support 2,000 union members and their families.



Bringing Christmas Cheer through Share-a-Gift

To bring Christmas joy to the less privileged during the festive season, FairPrice Foundation donated \$75,000 to the Boys' Brigade for the Share-A-Gift project. In addition, food donations including daily essentials and staples given by the community were packed into hampers and delivered to more than 40,000 beneficiaries from various Voluntary Welfare Organisations (VWOs) and government-funded ComCare Programmes.

Fostering Inclusive Employment for People with Disabilities


Going into our 5th year, we have been supporting SPD with its Transition to Employment programme that helps re-integrate people with acquired disabilities back to the mainstream workforce and the community. This year, we supported their efforts with a \$60,000 donation.



Empowering Children: Supporting School-Readiness

We lend our support to help children from low-income families be school-ready with a \$70,000 donation to the Chinese Development Assistance Council's (CDAC) "Ready For School" project. The initiative offers children a strong start by providing transport and school-ready vouchers, alleviating the financial burden of education expenses on their families at the beginning of the academic year.






Helping the Vulnerable through Community Chest

Together with our strategic partners, we continue to support the Community Chest in its efforts to reach all the vulnerable groups through its network of social service agencies. To help them, we pledged a donation of up to \$280,000 through the annual Heartstrings Buy initiative. Since 2019, FairPrice Foundation, FairPrice Group and its suppliers have collectively donated over \$1,300,000.

The funds will be directed to over 100 social service agencies and over 200 critical programmes supported by Community Chest, benefiting various vulnerable groups, including adults with disabilities, children with special needs, youths-at-risk, persons with mental health conditions, seniors and families in need of assistance.
